

BARANGAY HISTORY

Barangay Bagong Sikat is located in the eastern part, 11 kilometers from the Talavera town proper. Accordingly, Bagong Sikat is just a sitio of barangay San Ricardo. The family of Norte, Cajucom, Binuya and White were among the first dwellers of the place. But before the first settlers came, accordingly the place is just like a forest where wild pigs, monkeys and wild cats dwell.

Equipped with natural industry, they started to clear the place. It was in 1935 when the first settlers who clear the place got the formal rights of ownership to the land they clear. But suddenly, a certain Maria Pelarez came to tell that the place was a part of the Hacienda Tinio owned by family Tinio that include Maria Pelarez.

However, records of the Bureau of Lands, confirmed that the place is a Homestead, and therefore, it is owned by the government.

Honorable Ambrocio Fausto, the then town mayor of Talavera batted in the problem and he led the affected families to file legal actions against Maria Pelarez. The decision of the court however, favored the families who cleared the place and was declared the lawful owner of the place which they cleaned.

Jubilant and happy as they were, because of the favorable decision, the families together with the town mayor Hon. Ambrocio Fausto called the place "Bagong Sikat" or new shine, since they shone anew and popular in fighting. It was in the year 1935 when Bagong Sikat was enacted into law to become one of the barangays of Talavera.

Today, Bagong Sikat is one of the most progressive barrio of Talavera in terms of farming.
