

BARANGAY HISTORY

Barangay Basang Hamog is one of the barrios of the de Leon Estate (Hacienda de Leon), which is cleaned by the first dwellers through Homestead. But their rights to dwell in the place which they cleaned were denied upon learning that the place is still a part of the wide Hacienda Llamas. When the ownership of the place was transferred to Kapitan Pepe de Leon, their houses were demolished by the constabularies through a court order.

Barangay basang Hamog is a former forest wherein trees with wide leaves grew. There are so many trees on it that is why accordingly, if you will see the place from a distance, the place looks like a blue ocean. The temperature of the place is quite cold, and moist here is flowing like rain showers. This moist (Hamog in Tagalog), made the land so wet. Moist are clearly seen in the leaves of the trees even during dry season, however, it is noticeable that when the trees are being cut one by one, the fog which produced moist also disappears, it is in this case that the place was named Basang Hamog (wet by moist), when it is founded in 1914, barely two years after Tabacao was founded.

Most of its first dwellers were from the province of Tarlac, Pangasinan and La Union and from the towns of Aliaga, Guimba and Cuyapo. These migrants were Dionisio Baniqued, Maximo Genove, Marcelino Eblacas, Melquiades Domingo, Francisco Santiago, Fernando calma, Felipe Madamba, Esteban Dumo, Fermin Madayag, Potenciano Genove, Hipolito Eugenio, Anselmo Eblacas, Pablo Dumo, Emeterio Padua, Juan Bautista, Silvino Pablo, Flaviano Gonzales, Ambrocio Balucating, Fernando Bulado, Pedro Bulado, Juan Agaton, Florentino Onia, Eladio Santiago and Gabriel Corpuz.

It was in 1948 when all of the dwellers evacuated near the national highway when the place is not yet peaceful and they just go back to the barrio upon learning that the place is already peaceful and nice to live at once more.

San Roque is the patron saint of Basang Hamog.
